 The product is designed to provide a return in the form of (1) conditional interest payments and (2) a cash payment on termination of the product. The timing and amount of these payments will depend on the performance of the underlyings. If, at maturity, the final reference level of the worst performing underlying has fallen below its barrier level, the product may return less than the product notional amount or even zero.

Termination on the maturity date: If the product has not terminated early, on the maturity date you will receive:

1. if the **final reference level** of the **worst performing underlying** is at or above its **barrier level**, a cash payment equal to GBP 1,000; or

2. if the **final reference level** of the **worst performing underlying** is below its **barrier level**, a cash payment directly linked to the performance of the **worst performing underlying**. The cash payment will equal (i) the **product notional amount** multiplied by (ii) (A) the **final reference level** of the **worst performing underlying** divided by (B) its **strike level**.

Under the product terms, certain dates specified above and below will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). Any adjustments may affect the return, if any, you receive.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the **underlyings**, the product and the issuer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

The product is intended to be offered to retail investors who fulfil all of the criteria below:

- 2. they seek income, expect the movement in the underlyings to perform in a way that generates a positive return. They have a long investment horizon and understand that the product may terminate early;

The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances. 3. What happens if BBVA Global Markets B.V. is unable to pay out?

5. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 6 years

This Product will mature on 31 May 2030. This Product doesn't allow the Client to cancel his investment before 31 May 2030. However, under normal market conditions, BBVA may facilitate to the client the price at which BBVA is able to buy it. Such a price will be calculated subtracting (i) from the fair value of the Product calculated by BBVA in accordance to the market variables and methodologies commonly used in market (ii) an estimated cost of 1.5% over the Nominal Amount. This anticipated sale may generate a financial loss to the Client.
